
# ■ Stagecoach to Review its Services 2 and 2A

I have been talking to Stagecoach about their Services. Whilst the new Service has gone down very well with some people in Abbeymead, the new 2 and 2A Services haven't been as well received in Abbeydale. Journey times into town have increased, and Stagecoach have promised to look at these two routes again.

# ■ Morrisons Plans to demolish the Ridge and Furrow on hold

Morrisons plans to demolish The Ridge and Furrow and build a petrol filling station have still not appeared before the City Councils Planning Committee. I worked with local campaigners to get the pub listed as a Community Asset. At the moment more bore holes are having to be sunk to see if the water courses below the surface there will interfere with the petrol tanks.

# COUNCIL TAX FROZEN FOR FOURTH YEAR RUNNING



■ The Conservative-run City Council has frozen council tax again making it the fourth year in succession that its share of the bill hasn't increased. And Conservatives have pledged no increase in bills for next year as well. Freezing the Council tax for four years has saved residents of a Band D property £220. The freeze is despite having to make major savings to help sort out the economic mess the last Labour Government left behind. Over the last four years, the City Council has made savings of £7.5 million, with another £3 million planned over the next two years.

The Council's budget has effectively been reduced by a quarter. This has been achieved largely through improving efficiency and reducing layers of management. Importantly the services that matter to you have been protected. The latest saving by the Conservative-run council is to manage without a highly-paid Chief Executive. The record of council tax rises over the last 20 years tells its own story. Only the Conservatives can be trusted to deliver the right services and keep control of costs.
