# NEW RESOURCES INSTALLED IN ABBEYMEAD

Park. We are pleased to advise that the work has been carried out and that the new springer is in place. We hope that children will enjoy the new addition to the play park.

Cllr Laura Pearsall says, "I'm pleased to see young people are benefitting from this equipment which we spent some of last year's allocation on. Next year Gordon and I will be receiving $£ 2,000$ between us to spend in Abbeymead, so I would encourage anyone who feels there is something that the area would benefit from to contact us and let us know your ideas."

## NEW RECYCLING SERVICE DELIVERING RESULTS

- Thank you for your patience as the new recycling service bedded in over January, we are aware that several areas in Abbeymead had day and week changes, which may have caused some initial confusion, but we are happy this is all now running smoothly.
Since commencement of the new recycling service on 16th January over 360 tonnes of new material has been diverted away from landfill. Mixed plastics makes up over 60\% of this new material with cardboard making up $34 \%$ and the remainder being textiles. Participation levels are promising across most areas of the city.
Cllr Gordon Taylor said, "It is looking likely that over the next year we will achieve our $5 \%$ increase in recycling target and we are also hopeful of diverting a further 1000 tonnes of material away from landfill. I've noticed how much lighter my black bin is now when I take it out and I think I might need a third green box as we can recycle so much more! It's a great improvement to the service."

# NEW PATH TO ABBEYMEAD SCHOOL 

The new pedestrian entrance and footpath, running from Lobleys Drive car park through to link up with the existing footpath which leads to Abbeymead Primary School, reported in the last AbbeyViews newspaper has now been constructed and the work completed.
This is great news for Abbeymead residents as it makes it much easier for you to walk to Abbeymead

Primary School from Lobleys Drive.

Laura and Andrew have recently been to see the new footpath and spoken with a number of residents who are extremely pleased to see this new addition and agreed it will certainly benefit residents going forward.
The car park was previously pretty muddy, making this a difficult cut through to use for the school and facilities in Abbeymead.


## GARDEN WASTE SCHEMETHE FAGTS

- The garden waste scheme is for Gloucester residents who wish to participate and is not mandatory. Since 2011 it has cost $£ 36$ per annum for 25 fortnightly collections, equivalent to $£ 1.44$ per collection. This price will rise for the first time in October 2017 to $£ 42$ and in October 2018 to $£ 44$, equivalent to $£ 1.76$ per collection.

This service is considered by most residents to be good value. Your garden waste has to be recycled somehow, either by you composting in your own garden or taking it to Hempsted. Compare the alternative of bagging all the garden waste, loading it into the car, queuing at


Hempsted, and cleaning the residue from the car later.
The Lib Dems accuse Gloucester City Council of using this service to tax and profiteer from recycling but any excess revenue is ploughed back into the waste and recycling service, of which the green waste collection is just a part and which annually costs a total of over $£ 6$ million.
