## NORMAI GRASS CUTTING SCHEDULE RESUMED

■ All our partners were asked to suggest ways to save money to help the City Council deal with reductions in funding. Amey suggested a reduction in frequency of grass cutting which would give a significant saving without, they suggested, affecting the quality of the environment. We agreed to a 3 month trial with 2 weekly cuts on main routes and 6 weekly in our neighbourhoods.
Laura and Gordon have received a vast number of complaints about the state of the grass and we agree with you. Amey didn't even achieve the 6 weekly cycle but instead took 9 weeks. The trial has now ended and we will now revert to more frequent cutting. Indeed our Cabinet Member is demanding extra resources are brought in to catch up and make the city tidy again.
We do apologise for the mess you have had to endure during this experiment.

## PLAY YOUR PART IN KEEPING ABBEYMEAD TIDY!

- Your local councillors have recently received a number of complaints regarding littering in Abbeymead, particularly on the fields behind Abbeymead Primary School. Much of this is down to some individuals who do not use the bins provided or take their rubbish home.
Laura has looked into the number of litter bins in the areas of concern and has been advised that there are adequate so as not to add to the problem. She has also had tri-signs installed in certain areas to encourage individuals to use the bins provided.
Let's all try to keep Abbeymead tidy by looking after our own areas and above all dealing with our rubbish responsibly.

## NEW RECYCLINC SERVCE CAMPACN LAUNGHED

Since the improved recycling service was launched back in January, Gloucester residents have really got on board and as a result more than 800 tonnes of additional recycling has been collected in Gloucester. This six week campaign, which launched on 12th June, urged city residents to 'Recycle More' and think about what they are throwing away.
